Methodology



PASOS 2019: Representative cross-sectional study 8 to 16 y.o.

3887 participants from 247 educational centers (CE) of the 17 Autonomous Communities.

13 groups carried out the data collection in 2019.


Does not Work Non-university AMI < the median






Results

Prevalence of overweight, obesity, severe obesity and abdominal obesity - According to NSE



OR overweight, obesity, severe obesity and abdominal obesity - Child population <SES

Conclusions

- The SES is associated with the weight status of the child and adolescent population in Spain.
- Design of prevention and treatment interventions that include multiple determinants of childhood obesity and involve different sectors adapted to the socioeconomic reality of families.
- Guarantee adequate access to the necessary resources to achieve and maintain a healthy weight through wellness policies.
- Definition and scientific consensus of socioeconomic indicators in the field of childhood obesity.
- Continue innovating in evaluation methodologies and tools adapted to the reality of families with lower SES.
